## VISION

Break the cycle of addiction in families.

## MISSION

Provide comprehensive, coordinated services related to the treatment and recovery of chemically dependent women and their families, resulting in sustainable self-sufficiency.

## INTRODUCTORY FACTS

- STEP2 is a 501 (c)(3) organization started in 1986.
- STEP2 was the first substance abuse treatment facility in Nevada to offer a safe place for women to re-unify with their children.
- Because of the scope of services offered, length of program and community partnerships, STEP2's success rate remains higher than the national average.
  - STEP2's average success rate is 50% compared to the national success rate of 17%.

## STATISTICS

- The average age of a woman in treatment at STEP2 is 32.
- Women stay in treatment for an average of 9-15 months.
- Approximately 200 women seek treatment each year. **In 2018, STEP2 served 210 women and 408 children.**
- On average, 17% of clients are pregnant upon admission to STEP2. In the past five years, 100% of babies born into the program were born drug free.
- 84% of STEP2's clients report a family history of substance abuse.

## REFERRALS

- Women find their way to STEP2 through many different sources. In 2018, our number one referral source was actually women self-admitting with no referral. Our number two source was the court system and number three was CPS referrals.

## FUNDING

- Grant funding is STEP2's largest revenue source at approximately 65% of its budget.
- Less than one percent of STEP2's revenue comes from the clients themselves and potential clients are never turned away due to inability to pay for services.
