For over three decades, we have been providing gender-specific supportive services to women, including those who are pregnant, parenting, or have young children. We firmly believe that being a parent should never be a barrier to receiving the help you need. We are here to ensure that every woman has access to the care and support she deserves.

That's why we provide a comprehensive continuum of care that focuses on healing both women and their children. But our support doesn't end there. We also provide transportation assistance, domestic violence advocacy and education, and on-site mental health assessment, therapy, and medication assistance. We believe that true recovery goes beyond sobriety - it means equipping women with the tools and skills they need to break free from the cycle of addiction and create a better life for themselves and their children.

At STEP2, we are more than just a program - we are a lifeline.

We are here to walk alongside women during their recovery, offering unwavering support, compassion, and understanding. We believe that every woman deserves a chance at a brighter future, and we are committed to helping them achieve it.

The Mathewson Family Counseling Center

STEP2 focuses on early recovery by providing stability, structure and development of an individualized treatment plan for each woman who steps through our doors. These women engage in assigned groups, individual sessions and activities. The majority of these sessions happen inside the comforts of the Mathewson Family Counseling Center. This 13,000 square foot building, built with bricks that had been returned to BASALITE and generously donated to STEP2, represents all that we are.



Redfield Residence



Our Redfield Residence is a 20-bed residential facility built in 2016 on our existing Lighthouse Campus. The majority of the women entering our program are assessed to be in need of residential treatment. During this critical time, STEP2 uses evidence-based substance use disorder treatment interventions combined with comprehensive services in order to provide a holistic approach to recovery, increased health, family stability, self-sufficiency and improved quality of life.

This building is designed as a nurturing healing residence that includes dorm-style rooms, a commercial kitchen and outdoor spaces that are conducive to a therapeutic environment. It was built not only to support and facilitate state-of-the-art counseling and technology, client safety, and quality care, but to also embrace the client, family, and caregivers in a psychosocially supportive therapeutic environment.



Lighthouse Campus



The Lighthouse Campus is our transitional housing neighborhood established in 2001. We have 25 cottages that permit our women to receive outpatient treatment while still living in a safe environment on the STEP2 campus. Our one, two, and three bedroom homes provide a therapeutic community to our families, as they progress to a less restrictive treatment program.

Once a woman has successfully completed residential treatment she is eligible to apply to live in one of our Lighthouse cottages. A woman and her children move into a fully furnished home (furnished entirely by community donations) and upon successful completion of treatment, she will take all of the furnishings with her when she moves to her next home.

STEP2 is proud to partner with courts, CPS and other agencies to support moms in reunifying with their minor children, allowing them to come together in the comforting environment of her Lighthouse cottage.

Women are responsible for paying rent, with the first month being free, the second month at half rent, and starting from the third month, full rent is required. They are encouraged to stay for a year but are not restricted to just one year. STEP2 can offer positive rental history references for women who maintain financial compliance.

During their stay on our Lighthouse Campus, our residents receive comprehensive support services, which include case management to address monthly budgets, scheduling, childcare, TANF, resource access, and future housing needs.

Partnerships in the community allow for our women to enter into the workforce smoothly and for them to receive ongoing support to attain employment offering a livable wage.

The women living on our campus form a "Community Council" and are responsible for maintaining a healthy and active community, as well as giving back in the form of peer mentorship to residential clients and community service through maintaining the campus and garden.


